

Here are some highlights of what WPAOG has achieved for the Long Gray Line in 2024!



Cadet Passport

WPAOG introduced Cadet Passport in Spring 2024. This online portal, marketed as "All About You," aims to inform and inspire cadets about the Margin of Excellence opportunities that you help make possible.

As cadets engage in activities, their specific involvement is displayed on their portal, creating a personalized snapshot for sharing and building resumes. If a cadet has not participated in a category, the portal provides information on how to access these opportunities.

Survivors Support Community

The WPAOG Memorial Support Program launched a new initiative called Survivors Community. This is a meaningful service opportunity for both WPAOG and all members of the Long Gray Line to connect survivors living with grief and in need of comfort to reassure them that they are not alone in experiencing loss.

After speaking with many of the graduates' survivors and hosting several focus groups, it became clear that there are members beyond the surviving spouse who need support:

- the Grad who is the Survivor
- the Parents of a Graduate
- the Young Family who loses a Parent (graduate or partner)
- the Adult Next of Kin

The goal is to connect, share, and support these West Point families through events, communication, and resources.


Promotion Recognition

Veterans Services

The WPAOG **Veterans Services Program** educates, connects, and empowers West Point graduates and their families about veterans' benefits. Aiming to ensure every Long Gray Line member feels supported and valued, it enhances the Grads Helping Grads program to preserve the spirit of West Point. Susan Irons Beachler '89, WPAOG Veterans Services Officer, has connected with nearly 300 graduates or family members and held webinars on VA health care, disability compensation, survivor benefits, and more. Monthly, she offers educational webinars for all graduates and training for Volunteer Veterans Services Liaisons (VVSLs), a new role for West Point Societies and Classes, crucial to the program's success.

Veterans Services supports WPAOG Career Services, Class Services, and the West Point survivor community, receiving positive feedback from graduates and their families.
